




**Mad Mabel**


When the police open a new



## Tech Tips from the Library's Tech Support Team


### Samsung phone users & glitches with their phones:

We have had a surge of Samsung phones with 'glitching' apps.

Samsung are pushing that you get apps via their "Store" app:



Continue to get your apps through the Google "Play Store" app, not pop-up links:



As this will reduce your chance of bugged software loading to your phone.

Remember to check before you click!



### Older mobile phones not being able to call 000 Emergency Services

In early 2026, Australian telecommunications providers (Telstra, Optus, TPG/Vodafone) are blocking older and "grey market" (imported) mobile phones from their networks. This action follows a 2025 finding that approximately 70 older Samsung models and certain older iPhones could not connect to Triple-Zero (000) emergency services, which is required by Australian law.

- **Deadline:** Telstra began blocking in late 2025, with final deadlines for Optus and TPG/Vodafone stretching into January and February 2026.
- **The Problem:** Affected phones cannot properly switch to another network to make a 000 call if the user's primary network is unavailable, a crucial safety feature.
- **Action Required:** Users receive a notification via SMS or email, providing a **28-day warning** to update or replace their device before it is fully blocked from accessing all Australian mobile networks.
- **Affected Devices:** Primarily older Samsung Galaxy models (often 2015–2021) and some older iPhones (like iPhone 8, 8 Plus, and X) that have not updated to necessary software versions, particularly those operating on non-Australian software, are at risk.

### How to Check:

Users are advised to send a text message with the number **3** to **3498** to check if their phone is compatible, or use the IMEI checker on their telco's website.

### What to do if you receive a message:

1. **Update Software:** Immediately go to Settings > Software Update to ensure your phone is running the latest software, which can fix many affected models.
2. **Replace Device:** If your phone is on the list of non-compliant devices, you must replace it within 28 days to maintain service.
3. **Check with Provider:** If you are unsure, check your provider's (Telstra, Optus, Vodafone) website for lists of impacted Samsung models.

## Citizen Science Corner

March and April mark the Bogong Moth's autumn return migration, as they travel from the Australian Alps back to their breeding grounds in the lowlands of Victoria and the eastern states. With the Easter break here and people out walking, camping and exploring, it's the perfect time to keep an eye out.

Each year, Endangered Bogong Moths complete an incredible journey of up to 1,000 km. At the same time, critically endangered Mountain Pygmy possums wake from hibernation under the snow, relying on these moths as a vital food source to survive and raise their young.

If you spot a Bogong Moth, log it on Moth Tracker. Every sighting helps researchers track their movements and protect the future of these remarkable animals.

Out and about this Easter? Spot it. Log it. Protect it.

### Want to support your teen with anxiety or depression?



#### What is *Partners in Parenting*?

- Evidence-based, online program designed to help build your skills and confidence to support your teen's mental health
- Covers parenting challenges such as communication, managing strong emotions, boundaries, conflicts, and staying involved in your teen's life while they navigate their independence

#### You will:

Receive **one of two versions** of Partners in Parenting:

- **Self-guided version** (explore the online program at your own pace)
- **Peer-guided version** (paired with a 'PiP Coach' who has lived experience of caring for a teenager with mental health challenges)

#### You may be eligible if you:

- are an adult caring for a teen aged 12-17 years
- are concerned about your teen's anxiety or depression
- can read, write, hear, and speak English
- have regular internet access
- live in Victoria

#### You will be asked to:

- Complete some surveys at 3 time points over 12 months
- Complete up to 10 online modules, weekly
- If you receive the peer-guided version of the program, complete up to 10 online coaching sessions with a PiP Coach
- All parents and teens who complete surveys will receive e-gift vouchers (up to \$80 for parents, up to \$45 for teens)
