






uLibrary e-audio book of the month

Home Library delivery service


The Home Library service is available to all members who are housebound or in aged care and reside within the Swan Hill city limits.





How to login using the StoryBox app


- 1. Select 'Login with Library Access'
- 2. Select Swan Hill Regional Library
- 3. Enter your barcode and PIN/password
- 4. Discover an ever-growing digital library!

How to login using the website:

- 1 Head to storyboxlibrary.com.au/libraries
- 1. Select your public library or Local Government Area (LGA) from the dropdown menu.
- 2. If you see both barcode and PIN/password fields, enter the same details you use to access your library catalogue to log in.
- 3. If you just see a barcode field, enter your library barcode number, click log in...
- 4. Then confirm your details on the next page to register your individualised account.

5. Once you've confirmed these details, you can access a world of stories! You'll now be able to create personalised playlists, select your own account preferences, use a 'Remember Me' feature, and access our app once it launches.

When logging in to your individualised account in the future, continue to select your library or LGA from the dropdown menu and enter your barcode and PIN/password.

10 years old at the time, Robyn tells the story of her life on the farm, the kidnapping and the aftermath in the long road for justice. 'Faraday' is narrated through the lens of childhood trauma, and the effect it had on her family. Robyn lives in Lake Boga with her husband and two badly behaved cats. She enjoys her role as a Maternal and Child Health Nurse.
