




An Eye For An Eye Jeffrey Archer


Serious or Scam?: This online quiz will open 9am, October 1 and close 2pm, October 18. Competitors with the highest score at each branch will win a \$50 gift card.

'Faraday' author talk with Robyn Howarth

Robyn Howarth was the eldest of six female students who, along with their young female teacher, were kidnapped by two masked men from the tiny Faraday State School in 1972.

Robyn, 10 years old at the time, tells the story of her life on the farm, that heinous event and the aftermath in the long road for justice. Narrated through the lens of childhood trauma and the effect it had on her family, it has taken Robyn 52 years to acknowledge with pride that she came from Faraday and was educated at Faraday State School 797.

Robyn lives in Lake Boga with her husband David and two badly behaved cats and enjoys her role as a Maternal and Child Health Nurse working for the Victorian State Government Department of Health.

Voting closes on Friday, 18 October at 5 pm so vote now!



Of the 35 members (or 'Genies') in attendance at the celebratory lunch, held at The Hub, seven become members of the society in its first year (pictured top left).

The first meeting of the society was held on 14 September, 1984 at Dowling House.

The society aims to encourage and assist members in the study of genealogy and also to promote research of the history of Swan Hill and district. The group's collections have grown over the years and now includes extensive holdings of microfiche, CDs, USBs, local and district histories, cemetery records, shipping records, local parish maps, books and newsletters.

The society is based in the Swan Hill Library and volunteers are available to assist members of the public with local and family history research from 10am to 3pm on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Non-members may be required to pay a research fee.


